NOTES ON THE PROGRAM

John Corigliano - Biography

John Corigliano grew up surrounded by musical activity. His father, the late John Corigliano, Sr., was the celebrated concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic for twenty-three years, and his mother is an accomplished pianist. Despite much discouragement from his parents, the younger Corigliano chose composing as a career. His formal studies were with Otto Luening at Columbia University (B.A. cum laude, 1959), and later with Victor Giannini at the Manhattan School of Music. He is presently Distinguished Professor of Music at Lehman College, CUNY.

In most of Corigliano's scores, the theatrical element is strong. Disparate materials can run a gamut from conventional chords, tonal part-writing, regular metrics and passages in the style of eighteenth-century drawing-room music to tone-cluster structures, twelve-tone rows, violent offbeat

accents and avant-garde color effects. His widely played *Concerto for Clarinet and Orchestra* features antiphonal writing for brass and winds positioned around the concert hall; his *Pied Piper Fantasy* for flute and orchestra has a German chorale-manque, and a group of children who play flutes, tin whistles, and drums.

Mr. Corigliano has recently completed a full-length opera for the Metropolitan Opera with a working title *A Figaro for Antonia*, commissioned in honor of the Met's recent centenary. He has also written two film scores: for Ken Russell's *Altered States* (1981) and Hugh Hudson's *Revolution* (1985) for which he was awarded the Antony Asquith Award for Outstanding Achievement in Film Music by the British Film Institute in September, 1986.
